

1. ELIGIBILITY FOR PARTICIPATION

Eligible for participation in the tournament are all students and lecturers of classical and ancient studies as well as persons who work in the archaeological field (e.g. in a museum or at excavations). There is no objection against guest players - however, not more than two players who are not from the field of classical and ancient studies are allowed on the field at any given time. In case of blatant infringements, we reserve the right to exclude the team from the tournament.

2. CONTRIBUTION TOWARDS EXPENSES

All participants have to pay a participation fee of 15€. The same is true for persons who will attend the tournament for the complete weekend without actively participating in the football games on the pitch. This fee includes breakfast on Saturday and Sunday morning. Individual (*sic!*) players and supporters can of course register late at the WMC itself.

3. DRAWING OF THE GROUPS

There will be a seeded head of each group. They will be based upon the best of table of the past five years. For organisational reasons, we, as hosts, reserve the right to seat our own teams as heads in groups A to D. So the heads will be the following teams (subject to change):

- Group H: Berliner Karpeiken*

4. TEAMS

A team consists of six outfield players and a permanent goalkeeper. At least one woman has to be on the playing field at any time, more feminine power is willingly accepted, of course. If a team has not enough players, it may borrow a player from another team. However, this only applies when all players of the first team are on the pitch. If a team has not at least four players on the field (anymore), the game will automatically be counted as 3:0 for the opposing team. During a game you can substitute as often as wanted, this has to be done on your own responsibility ("flying substitution") during the time outs.

5. EQUIPMENT

Every team should be dressed in uniform jerseys (at least shirts). If two teams with the same jersey colour meet on the playing field, the organizer provides bibs. The participants should bear in mind to have proper footwear at hand. Due to pitch maintenance and the prevention of injuries, it is strictly forbidden

to wear shoes with metal studs. The use of shinguards sadly seems advisable taking the passion and lack of coordination of some players in account but is not compulsory.

6. PLAYING GROUNDS, GOALS AND BALLS

The games take place on four small turf pitches (c. 70 x 35 m). The goals are 5 m wide and 2 m high. The ball should be an usual globular exemplar of size 5.

7. PLAYING MODE

The matches take place in seven groups with six teams each and one group with seven teams. One game consists of two half times of ten minutes without any half time break. After the first halftime, the players only change sides. The positioning in the groups results from the points won in the group matches (victory: 3 points, draw: 1 point). In case of a tie in points, the direct confrontation is considered first, and in case of a draw in this match, the goal difference (special arrangement regarding more than two teams equal in points: goal difference as primary criterion, direct confrontation as secondary). If even both difference and amount of scored goals are identical, the position will be decided by lot or discussion of the teams involved.

Each group's first two teams qualify for the knockout round and compete in eighth, quarter, semi and finals. The losers of each knock out round face the other losers of this round in knockout placement matches. Similarly, the teams in the third and fourth shall compete in a round for ranking with k.o.-system (two matches for each team), the fifth and sixth ranks in the groups have one placement match.

8. REFEREES

Since the last years' „professional“ referees did not necessarily guarantee fair games and a uniform system of rules, we'll hire members of teams not involved as referees. On the pitch, they have the only and therefore also the last word.

9. PENALTIES

A penalty of two minutes is inflicted immediately for rude fouls and excessively enthusiastic arguing. Repeated gamesmanship entails an immediate exclusion of the respective player from the tournament.

10. RETURN PASS

Goalkeepers are not allowed to catch the ball by hand when it is passed by foot by a member of their own team. A return pass by header or by other body parts (e.g. a student's trained beer belly) is excluded from this rule.

11. GOAL-KICK/THROW-IN

If the ball is kicked beyond the endline by the offenders, it may only be brought back into the running game with a flat goal-kick. In doing so, the ball may not directly cross the centre line before another player of the same or the opposing team has contact with it. A goalkeeper's pass which occurs in the running game

is excluded from this rule. If the ball is kicked beyond the sideline, it is brought back into the running game with a throw-in. It is not allowed to roll the ball back in.

12. OFFSIDE

This rule does not apply.

13. OVER-TIME/PENALTY SHOOT-OUT

Starting with the round of the last sixteen, there is an overtime of five minutes if a game is a tie after the regular playing time. If the game is still drawn after the overtime, it is decided in a penalty shoot-out.

For the penalty shoot-out, every team has to choose five shooters including at least one woman. If the game is still drawn after that, one player of the first team faces one of the other team until there is a winner to the game. The original five shooters may now be chosen to shoot again.

In games for the position in the final ranking of the tournament, the penalty shoot-out directly follows after the regular playing time in case of a tie. If the opposing teams agree on the tie, they may share the achieved position and refrain from a penalty shoot-out.

14. ABILITY FOR PLAYING ON THE MORNING AFTER

Like every year, we advise every player who may not be able to see let alone walk straight in the morning not to actively participate in any football game. This regulation is particularly meant to prevent the participants from injuries as well as to prevent any controversies resulting from uninhibited emotions. In case of infringements, we reserve the right to escort the troublemaker from the playing field directly to a cold shower.



15. PROHIBITION OF BARBECUE

Since the tournament will take place exclusively on the grounds of the college sports (University Bonn), it will be forbidden to light any open fire, including BBQ and pyrotechnics. The university's management and we reserve the right to control this rule and to punish infringements.

We will see to student appropriate prices for food and drinks!

16. PROHIBITION OF GLASS

There will be a strict prohibition of glass for the whole tournament - according to the terms of the University of Bonn and as well resp. primarily in our own best interest. The university's management and we reserve the right to control this rule and to punish infringements.

17. SMOKING

As in all public buildings, smoking is strictly prohibited in the buildings on the

sport grounds.

18. LITTER

You will get a bag for rubbish during the registration of your team against a security deposit, in order to prevent that the grounds look like Rome after the sack by the Visigoths. It'll have to be given back filled with your litter at the end of the tournament.

19. PARKING AND CAMPING



20. MODIFICATIONS


We reserve the right to modify the rules at any time until the beginning of the tournament.

The noble sport of football has its roots in ancient rituals, as M. Meiers groundbreaking article under the lemma *Apopudobalia* (Ἀποπουδοβαλία) suggests: „The details remain unknown[, even though] ἄνδρες ἀποπουδοβαλόντες are already verified in 4th century BC [...] thanks to the *Gymnastika* by Achilles Tacticus (fr. 3)“.[1] Subsequently, the sport gained some popularity during the late Roman Republic. It's not a stretch to assume that at this point the sportsmen had already amassed loyal supporters from the nobilitas and proletarians alike, as the listing of some of these apopudobalontic celebs in the pseudo-Ciceronian text *De viris illustribus* (3,2) proves.

During the Roman Empire's northward expansion in the 1st and 2nd century AD, the *popudobalia* are likely to have become an integral part of Roman lifestyle in Britain, alongside *vinum dulce* and *garum*. Archaeological surveys of the last decades have indicated that the cultivation and popularization of the noble sport is tied to the development of the Roman military and its periphery, as shown by the numerous camps with (artificial) turf walls and (usually four) openings apparently functioning as goals, among other clues. However, past scientists have glossed over the sportive-cultish aspects by making up military terms.[2]

At least since the decline of the Roman hegemony, the sport had sunk into obscurity in all halfway civilized regions of Europe. All? No, one small village in Cambridgeshire preserved the fundamentals making out the body of rules through oral tradition from one generation to the next and the other way round. Starting there, the ball rolled anew over continental Europe from the second half of the 19th century onward, and soon the rest of the globe.[3]

The mythical beginnings of archaeological football go back to the 1970s AD, when everyone and his dog still wore flare trousers and sideburns. Thanks to the oral lore and the accounts of a carefully selected group of representants associated with different institutions, we can partly grasp the orgiastic rituals that were being held during those secret encounters on big green fields. This phase of cultural development is called *praepedifolium* by modern scientists. At this juncture, reference should be made to the legendary duels between Cologne and Bonn, or the authentic reports concerning Bonn's away games in Bavaria.

Aside from that, there have been numerous small tournaments between just a few different insitutes, carried out inbetween irregular time intervals and with a comparably loose and fa-

miliar atmosphere, often not lasting more than a single day. After the big gathering in 1990 on the field of Poll, it was apparently decided to establish a *Winckelmanncup*.[4] The small amount of reference points for the pre- and early history of the WMC demonstrates once again the importance of a thoroughgoing investigation concerned with the tournament's genesis, as it is still understudied, even by those archaeologists most specialized in the archaeopopudobalontic field. Further surveys conducted by the DFG (Dresdner Fußballgemeinschaft) are recommended; the official historiography omits the vital role these Dark Ages played in the evolution of the tournament.

Not until the presence of the reformatio Bonnensis, decreed by the Rhenish primary rocks of Medusa Hofgarten in 1991, did the WMC enter the stage of factually backed world history – the declaration is to this day regarded as the starting point for the everlasting *pedifolium*. No more and no less than nine teams fought in this competition that is only winnable with the dubious blessing of Zeus on one's side, in order to get trophies, triumphal processions and animal sacrifices (also known as BBQ) dedicated to them. In the year 1 RB (see above), the panarchaeological, cultual-sportive feast was held near the Danube (Carnuntum) instead of the Rhine.



In accordance with the tried, tested and trusted principle of annuity it was determined to move to a different venue each year, resulting in the phenomenon known today as migration period and many homines novi subverting the old nobility and broadening the starting field. The countless drinking vessels prevalent in the archaeological contexts seem to affirm that the con-

vivial atmosphere as well as the religiously strict obedience to the rules that determine the procedure of libations were already common and eclipsed the competitive aspect. In the year 11 after the appearance of the WMGredeemers in the Rhineland, the number of participating teams exceeded 20 for the first time. Soon, more and more classical scholars squeezed their library-stealed bodies for several days into a tight, nifty jersey.

The social circumstances of the participants seem to have gone through some slight changes: While the guests of the party used to belong to the class of students who studied Classical Archaeology for the most part, now undergraduates of Pre- and Early History, Mediaeval Studies and non-university social individuals enriched the starting field. That is how the tradition of the WMC was nourished and refined at different sacred sites in the Central-European world during the past two decades, and, all the more remarkable, without a hiatus. The analysis of several beer bottles' and cans' provenience concluded that there's a widely spread WMC diaspora which is still continuing to grow. Apart from the German-speaking part, other countries represented in the holy rites include Great Britain, France, Italy, the Czech Republic, Poland, Romania, Slovakia and the Netherlands, hence the three-day festival promotes the amicable meeting and communication of the young and the young-at-heart archaeologists from all over Europe.

After two decades of WMC tournaments, the WMC magazine was published in late June 2011 (running to 80 pages), due to which the guys from Dresden forever gained a cozy front seat in our hearts and on the Mount

Olympus of WMG-related literature.



Recently discovered site of the Winckelmann-Culture on the Venusberg with survey results und magnetograms



The following is a list of the trophies that honour those half-gods who have been proven to be courageous and worthy of them while playing on the field...or doing random other things that deserve some kind of reward. The prizes are sorted after their first certain appearance during a tournament, so the order is intended to be chronological, but not necessarily accurate thus far. Remember, a passionate fan's corner equals any victory in a sports game. It's on! So get ready to rumble...

WINCKELMANN CUP

SINCE 1991 // WELL, DUH.

After being held hostage by the Austrians for several years, the cup mysteriously went to Germany for a good while. Some day, Switzerland decided that it would be safer to keep it in one of its top secret vaults, yet just before it was about to transform to cheese (that's the state in which everything ends up in Switzerland), it was finally released in the wilderness, freed from the almost unbearable burden that is known as the German language. The original trophy was abducted by a higher power around the millennial turn, leaving behind neither witnesses nor clues to trace its whereabouts. It was replaced by a monumental pea conserve which was succeeded by an Athena stele in 2001.

The current tropaeum ligneum is awarded since 2006 and already travelled through many different European countries (after the cup had resided in Berlin for 7 consecutive years, Team Spartacus probably felt a little sorry - and rightly so), including Wales, Italy and the Czech Republic.

USCHI CUP

SINCE 1991 // FOR THE MOST ATTRACTIVE MALE PLAYERS

Endowed in Arloff near Bonn by a local hostess named Uschi to honour the most masculine team in an appropriate manner. Among the laureates have been players from Wales, Italy, the Czech Republic, Switzerland, Germany and Austria. Wales got it two times, hitherto indicating that Zeus prefers Welsh women over others whenever he is in need of a son who can accomplish seemingly impossible tasks, for some inexplicable reason.

LAPIS IMPETUS

SINCE 1994 // FOR THE FIRST ARRIVING TEAM

The stumbling block goes to the first full team arriving at the WMC. There's no scientific study yet, but it seems like players from Bonn (4 times) and Cardiff (3 times) have more coffee than blood in their veins.

TOP SCORER

SINCE 1995 // FOR THE PLAYERS WITH MOST GOALS SCORED

The most efficient centre forward of the tournament can shoot his way into the hearts of the sexiest archaeologists (-> Willem Cup) and on the statistical Olympus in Dresden.

COPPA ARCHAEOLOG

SINCE 1997 // FOR GETTING THE BOTTOM POSITION ON THE LADDER

The history of this handsome award goes back to protopedifolic times, aka the late 1980s. Intended as the main prize's logical counterpart, its main purpose is to evoke the olympic spirit that the WMC attempts to convey. According to legend it was once meant to distinguish the best German team exclusively (thankfully, just a legend). The ladies from Andromeda Weyertal (Cologne) gained this trophy in 2011 and 2012 but the folks of the DASV have managed to win it last year - neglecting several physical laws of nature.

NEBRA-DISC

SINCE 2005 // FOR THE PROXIMATE TOURNAMENT HOST

In the first years it was common to let the winners (-> Winckelmann Cup) host the next tournament. In compliance with Ancient Roman tradition, an optimus munerarius for the following year is appointed by the senatus populusque archaeologicorum during the award ceremony. Currently, the sky disc graces the sacred temple of Kupperstift in Cologne.

WILLEM CUP

SINCE 2006 // FOR THE MOST ATTRACTIVE FEMALE PLAYERS

The WMC's role in the fight for woman's equality in football has been underestimated ever since the tournament came into existence, but it will take some time until renowned historians acknowledge this fact (one wonders, do they ever acknowledge archaeological evidence at all?), even though it's blatantly obvious to anyone who took part in the tournament at one time or another. Well, football history books won't be rewritten any time soon, but the drop dead beautiful she-wolves from Hamburg and Cologne are nonetheless proud of their well-deserved trophies, and both got it twice. Bottom line: Archaeology is sexy (in Cologne and Hamburg at least), whereas chemistry, philosophy, law, political science and maths are intolerant and backward-looking.

ROB CUP

SINCE 2006 // FOR THE HOST

This trophy goes to the institution that organized the tournament that nourishes and cherishes it until the next one. It's supposed to dignify the spirit, and the organization and work effort the competition depends on.

JABBA THE CUP

SINCE 2007 // FOR THE BEST FANS

The best fan's corner has been prized ever since the cup in Kiel. It appears like the loudest and most creative supporters have usually been from Germany - considering that German archaeologists of all people ought to be wary enough of the past, that's kind of remarkable and a little frightening too, isn't it?

WINCKY CUP

SINCE 2007 // FOR THE SMALLEST TEAM

Another trophy which was newly created in 2007 is meant to savour the smallest team. No surprise the award reserved for underdogs looks so tiny and fragile you can barely see it without a microscope.

FED CUP GÖTTINGEN

SINCE 2007 // FOR THE BEST AMATEUR TEAM

The trinity of awards newly created in Kiel is perfected by the brave Euergeten vom Schwarzen Stern Göttingen: The trophy aspired quickly to become one of the most desired and fiercely embattled awards, with the Teutonic hordes turning out to be rather professional at that. Speaking of professional, see „Jabba the Cup“ for the damning implications this particular winning streak might signify for German archaeologists and the rest of the world, unless it's just Kiel having suffered from a justified minority complex in 2007.

BEST PLAYER

SINCE 2008 // FOR THE BEST PLAYER

You're frustrated because everyone, EVERYONE!!!!1111!!! in your team sucks - besides yourself, right? No problem, here's an award to commend the best individual players, regardless if male or female.

BEST GOALIE

SINCE 2008 // FOR THE BEST GOALIE

Those tall players who are good at standing between two poles, awkwardly jumping and stretching their arms from time to time and being able to think of nothing but left and right for at least 30 minutes, those downright enviable players have a chance to win this prize all too effortlessly, at least that's what one is inclined to think whenever there's a chance to watch these ineffable towers of fear at work.

DEMOLITION TROPHY

SINCE 2009 // FOR THE BEST TENT CAMP

Many participants occupy tents that could best be described as impressive, creative or adventurous. The credit for the introduction of this award goes to Bamberg. If all three qualities are evident in the construction of your team's papiliones or tabernacula, congratulations! Let's hope the sky won't fall on your head, by Toutatis!

SINCE 2009 // FOR A SUCCESSFUL ARRIVAL AGAINST ALL ODDS OR OTHER PROBLEMS

LOCAL CUP

SINCE 2013 // FOR THE TEAM THAT BEST UPHELDS THE LOCAL TRADITIONS

The newest award is a sacrifice to the genius loci, for doing the things that are typical in the host's region, or adapting to its common stereotypes in an exceptional way. No wonder it was created in Munich, where the evolutionary adaptability was investigated, measured and rated by finding out the best team at stemming beer mugs.

PFEFFI CUP

SINCE 2014 // FOR THE FAIREST TEAM

Today was given up to press visits which I fear owing to the slow progress of the work enabled them to see but little.




One of my colleagues criticized your playing style for its supposed lack of elegance, and bemoaned that you tend to act like a libero from time to time.
